

Frequently Asked Questions

Why should I participate in The Table?

In one location you will be able to connect with the people at Harvest Community Church, put names to faces, pray for needs of people, explore ministry and group opportunities as well as find a place to serve. It allows us to “be the church” together in between Sundays.

How secure is The Table?

Every account is password protected and secured at every level by account-based permission checks. If the account attempting to access a piece of data doesn't have permission to see that data, the request is simply rejected. Furthermore, these requests are made over an HTTPS connection, protected by the same kind of strong encryption that banks use on their websites. The Table also has a professional-grade firewall in place, and has been “black box” audited by an online security testing tool called ZeroDayScan, and no vulnerabilities were found.

Why does The Table ask for personal information like my phone number, address and age?

It's a directory of people in your own church, the place to find and connect with others at Harvest! You can decide who can see your phone number—everyone in the directory or just staff. The Table will use your address with mapping software, although your exact house location will never be revealed. The Table asks for your age because federal law prohibits the sharing of e-mail addresses for individuals under the age of 13. In addition, The Table has some adult-teen interaction restrictions built into it. Remember, through the privacy settings on the profile page, you can control who has access to your information. Make public as much or as little as you are comfortable with. For more information, read The Table Privacy statement.

How do I sign up?

To create an account on the Harvest Table, go to <http://harvestccaz.tableproject.org/register/welcome>. Click on the button 'Join' and follow the instructions.

How do I login to my account once I've set it up?

Once you have created an account, go to <https://harvestccaz.tableproject.org> to login.

Why should I add a profile photo?

Your profile photo is important. People want to connect with a face, not a generic icon. Adding a photo gives your profile a face. It helps people recognize you. It even helps people learn your name. Next time at church they'll be able to greet you by name instead of just nodding politely. Remember that The Table is not Facebook. This is not the entire world learning your name and being able to recognize you. This is your church. So let's see your face! Not your dog or a cartoon or a generic icon.

It's always helpful to make your profile photo a close-up of your face. When you upload your image you have the option to crop the photo, so try to crop out other people so we can just see your smiling face. That way people know it's you and we don't have to squint at the tiny icon to figure out who you are.

Why should I add 'About Me' tags to my profile?

The Table is all about developing community in your church, and that starts by getting to know other people. One of the ways you can do that is to share interests and skills. Then you can connect with other people who have common interests. Maybe you'll find a bunch of other scrapbookers at your church or discover that you're not the only NASCAR fan.

Adding those tags helps other people get to know you better and connect with you. On Sunday morning those tags can be the difference between a conversation starter and standing around awkwardly. Keep the tags simple and generic so they're more useful.
